
The Journey of Lyall L. Gillespie ISO, AASA, FAIM, Assoc (Tech) IREE 1919 – 2006

Our contribution for the Heritage Festival this year is an exhibition featuring the life and work of Lyall Gillespie, the well-known Canberra historian. Lyall attended Hall School and lived in the village and the surrounding district as a young man.

In 2015 his son Neil bequeathed his father's collection to the centre and a team of committed volunteers, under Ken Heffernan's guidance, have been beavering away identifying, cataloguing and storing the thousands of items that make up his very eclectic collection.

The exhibition will be opened on **Sunday 14**th **April at 11 am** by Dr Ros Russell, a former colleague of Lyall's and a well-known historian and museum consultant. Members of Lyall's family will also be in attendance.

Visitors are most welcome on the day or on **Sunday 21**st & **28**th **April** when the centre will be open from **10am – 4pm**.

A feature of the display is the family's beautiful bible, inscribed with details of births, deaths and marriages over many generations.

Selected Southwell Stories, our 2023 ACT Heritage Festival exhibition, is about to be dismantled.
