The Bowning community were out in force on Saturday 9th March to celebrate the 175th anniversary of their rural school. The centre set up a heritage display that featured the history and travels of the Kangiara school bell, which once rang out its message in the Hall School's quadrangle.



Southwell family saddle donated

The Selected Southwell Stories exhibition came to an end last week and local members of the Southwell family held a final afternoon celebration at the Hall Heritage Centre.

Jane Southwell presented the centre with a 90 year old saddle that was given to her dad Mack (Malcolm) when he was a boy, learning to ride. His dad, John Southwell, purchased a *youth Poley* stock saddle in 1934 and over the years it has been extensively used - initially by Mack when he was wool classing and working full-time on two Southwell properties - *Rosevale* and *Fernhill* (present day Lyneham).

Jane's children, Kathleen & James used the saddle and their children Molly, Isabella and Charlotte have seen the saddle used by the family for the long trek to the Coolamine Homestead in the Kosciuszko National Park and for the Bicentennial trek from Kosciusko to Canberra.
